OVERVIEW

Burgess Hill Girls is an independent, day and boarding school for girls located in the centre of Burgess Hill, West Sussex.

The School was founded in 1906 by Beatrice Goode to provide a high-quality education for girls which was not widely available at the time. In 1928 the School moved from Church Road to its present location on Keymer Road in order to expand.

The School currently educates over 550 pupils, with boys and girls in the Nursery and girls only from Reception through to the Sixth Form.

The School's catchment area for day pupils extends across Sussex. It is well-connected by road (lying close to main roads such as the A23 to London and Brighton) and by train, just a few minutes' walk from the town's railway station with frequent direct services to Brighton, London and Gatwick Airport.

Living on-site there are approximately 50 boarders, typically full-term from across the globe.

Notable alumnae, called Bold Girls, include cricketer Caroline Atkins, actor Haydn Gwynne, presenter Holly Willoughby, neuroscientist Professor Francesca Happé and diversity champion, Funke Abimbola MBE.

CAMPUS

Burgess Hill Girls is set within 14 acres of beautiful grounds within a conservation area close to Burgess Hill town centre in the heart of Mid Sussex.

The site comprises of open playing fields surrounded by natural woodland. The buildings date back to 1704 and are a mixture of Victorian and Edwardian villas complemented with sympathetic contemporary buildings.

The newest additions to the site are the Croft II Performance and Music Academy and Little Oaks, a modern building encompassing Nursery and Infant classrooms.

PE CURRICULUM

PE is a thriving subject at Burgess Hill Girls and is extremely well supported by both staff and students. At present the department consists of three full time members of staff, six part-time members of staff with some external coaches. A PE lesson is 40 minutes long and at present is taught as follows:

Lower School

Years 7 and 8: 4 lessons per week (two doubles)

Upper School

Year 9: 4 lessons per week (two doubles) Year 10: 3 lessons per week (one triple) Year 11: 3 lessons per week (one triple)

Sixth Form

Years 12 and 13: 3 lessons per week (one triple)

PE is also taught at GCSE and A Level, and we follow the AQA syllabus for both qualifications.

CO-CURRICULAR SPORT

We provide a varied and extensive range of co-curricular activities, trips and opportunities. We see our role in extending these opportunities to each individual student as crucial to the development of their life skills, as well as adding stimulation and enjoyment beyond the taught curriculum. We believe education is about giving young people the chance to be successful in as broad a range of areas as possible, and to feel a sense of pride in their achievements.

Sport is a major part of our co-curricular programme; and we offer a wide range of sports such as hockey, netball, dance, football, trampolining, athletics, crosscountry, badminton, volleyball, rounders, cricket, tennis and more. Clubs are run during lunchtimes and after school, which enables us to cater for recreational and elite performance.

An extensive fixture list provides numerous opportunities for girls to represent the school and we consistently achieve significant success at local, county and national competitions. A large number of teams for our major sports enable as many girls to experience the competitive environment. We also enter team competitions in activities off-site such as equestrian, polo, skiing, sailing and rowing.

Our ethos of excellence in sport sits comfortably alongside a 'Sport for All' policy which promotes participation for fun, health and recreation.

Day trips and overseas sports tours are a regular feature in the school's calendar. Ski trips have recently included visits to Landgraaf and Flaine. Recent sports tours have included a Senior Netball and Hockey Tour to Barbados with upcoming tours to Disneyland Paris and Sri Lanka.

We also offer day and evening trips to watch live sport as well as the buzz of the GCSE and A Level students attending The Olympic Experience, Body Works Exhibition as well as a visit to Bath University.

- Provide leadership and development for all areas of sporting activity, including strategy, coaching, operations and facilities
- Plan, implement and deliver an appropriately broad and balanced curriculum for PE, sport and health for Years 7 to 13
- Teach academic PE up to GCSE and A Level
- Oversee the preparation and development of academic PE subject materials at GCSE and A Level
- Lead regular department meetings and arrange regular meetings with Head of Academic PE and Head of Prep School PE
- Ensure provision of appropriate sports and activity programmes to engage all pupils in sports and other recreational opportunities
- Have overall responsibility for the staffing and management of the School's programme of all sport
- Prepare and manage the annual departmental budget
- Responsible for the external hire of facilities and external coaches
- Responsible for organising a full fixture programme in a wide range of sports
- Make a major and leading contribution to the Sport co-curricular programme
- Be responsible for the appointment of coaches, liaising with HR to ensure safe recruitment
- Delegate appropriate roles and responsibilities within the PE department

- Design and implement the sports scholar programme, including acting as a mentor and 1:1 review and extension meetings with sports scholars
- Responsible for running sports days and sport celebration evening
- Prepare, monitor and update annual departmental review and development plan
- Ensure that schemes of work are used, reviewed and modified to enable the maintenance and development of high standards of teaching and learning
- Responsible for the appraisals in the biannual performance review process
- Oversee the development and training of all staff in the department
- Oversee assessment and reporting of student progress and achievement within the department
- Use a variety of delivery methods which will stimulate learning appropriate to pupil needs with good use of technology

- Proactivity and a strong team player, showing a clear and infectious passion and drive for sport, both 'for all' and to the 'elite' levels
